The Brandenburg Concerto nr. 2 is written for four solo instruments (trumpet, soft flute, oboe, violin), strings, continuo and double base. As a result it is difficult to make an arrangement with just a few parts. This arrangement is for sextet, with the four solo instruments in the voices 1-4 and the continuo in part 5. Strings are in different parts where needed and possible. Some careful choices of the registration remain necessary to produce four different sounds for the solo instruments.

This is quite a difficult arrangement in all parts, including the bass.
