Plaisir d' Amour is a song composed by Jean-Paul-Égide Martini (1741-1816). It was later orchestrated by Hector Berlioz (1803-1869). This arrangement for accordion quintet is based on that orchestration. A tremolo register is used in the first voice to make the lead song melody stand out from the accompaniment (orchestra). This arrangement is quite easy to play (but the part with 6 flats may be less easy to read by less experienced players). In the second voice it helps to have a larger ensemble to enable division of some parts into loco and 8va. (This can be avoided using an LMH register, but it sounds a bit better when using diviso.)
